GRANT ADVISORY -- \$1.77 MILLION AVAILABLE SPRING 2007

During the 2007 spring grant cycle, CYCC will offer grant funding for new projects in the three program categories described below. While CYCC continues to offer grant training throughout the State during the month of January, you may download the Request for Proposals (RFP) and Grant Application Kit at our web site, www.cycg.state.ga.us. If you do not have access to the Internet, please mail or fax a request on your letterhead, and a set of booklets will be mailed to you. Grant documents (electronic and hard copies) will be available January 1, 2007.

Attendance at a grant writing workshop is highly recommended. All program categories will be discussed at the training workshops listed on back of this page. Available funding for **NEW** projects and eligibility criteria are described below.

1) Juvenile Justice: \$850,000

CYCC will fund community based treatment programs serving juvenile offenders and primary prevention programs serving high-risk youth likely to engage in delinquent activity. Programs may also serve a combination of juvenile offenders and non-offenders. Suggested activities include after-school enrichment and education; youth employment; conflict resolution; detention alternative programs for juvenile offenders; balanced and restorative justice (BARJ); and gender-responsive programming for female youth. Eligible applicants include state government, local governments, school systems, and non-profit agencies, which have 501(c)(3) status and have been in existence for minimum of 12 months. For the 2007 grant cycle, applications for residential programming will not be considered.

2) Title V Prevention: \$577,400

Eligibility for this funding is limited to delinquency prevention programs serving high-risk youth within communities that have an established local children and youth coalition which has developed a comprehensive three-year prevention plan addressing the county's top priorities concerning children and youth. Suggested activities include after school enrichment and education; violence prevention; balanced and restorative justice (BARJ); and school-based case management and outreach services. Eligible applicants are county boards of commissioners that have approved a county-wide child advocacy coalition.

3) Abstinence Until Marriage: \$344,700

Funding available for the initiation of abstinence until marriage (AUM) programs targeting youth ages 12-29. Applicants are required to provide a 40% local match and utilize curriculum that is A-11 compliant in promoting abstinence until marriage. Programs are strongly encouraged to provide youth development activities such as mentoring, counseling, tutoring, character education and/or parental involvement. Eligible applicants include state and local governments, school systems, and non profit and faith-based organizations with 501(c) status that have been in existence for a minimum of 12 months.

Registration: Pre registration is NOT required. On site registration begins 15 minutes prior to each workshop.
Costs: No Charge
Application Deadline: Grant applications are due by March 5, 2007.
