RE: Announcement of the 14th GILEE Delegation to Israel in 2006

The 2006 Georgia Law Enforcement Delegation to Israel

GILEE is pleased to announce plans for the 14th annual delegation of law enforcement executives from Georgia to Israel to take place in late May, 2006 (a 2-week program). To the selected participants, GILEE awards complete coverage for the cost of a round-trip airline ticket from Atlanta to Tel Aviv as well as hotel accommodations. Complete "on ground" hospitality will be provided by GILEE and the Israel Police.

GILEE's objectives are: law enforcement executive development and international cooperation. Participation is open to all *chiefs, sheriffs, and directors/heads* of law enforcement agencies in Georgia. The delegation will also include a few law enforcement executives from other states. Only one application per agency will be considered. Space in the delegation is very limited; selection will be made by a committee comprised of representatives from the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police, the Georgia Sheriffs Association, and Georgia State University. Announcement of the selected participants should be made by the middle of December, 2005. GA POST training credits will be awarded. Upon program completion, all selected participants **must submit a written program report** about the professional experience gained in GILEE.

A letter of application (limited to 3 pages) is required. In it, applicants should:

1. Identify a problem in their agency and/or their community
2. Describe how participation in the GILEE program is expected to resolve the problem
3. Describe how participation in the program will benefit the:
 - a. applicant
 - b. applicant's agency
 - c. applicant's locality
4. Describe plans to disseminate information about the Israel experience (in your agency, in other law enforcement agencies, and in the community)

Letters must include a brief, 1-2 page, resume. All applications and resumes must be received **no later** than 12:00 noon, Tuesday, December 6, 2005, addressed as follows:
