Please read the below General Announcement from GEMA regarding the Bradford Police Department in the tornado struck area of Tennessee: Your assistance would be appreciated.

As a result of the devastating Tornado that struck West Tennessee on Monday, April 3, 2006, the Police Department of Bradford in Gibson County was completely destroyed. The Headquarters Bldg. and all patrol vehicles were totally destroyed. This 15-man force lost everything. They are coping with the death of 24 of their friends and neighbors in the community.

Chief Bond and his men, were the first in Tennessee to call the SEOC and offer to join an EMAC response to Katrina and Rita and Wilma. I assigned them to a Law Enforcement Strike Team representing small agencies in West TN which responded to Southern Mississippi for a 14 day period. I have a number of testimonials from citizens of Mississippi praising the officers on that strike team.

The Officers need radios, vests, uniforms, everything and anything. They have nothing recoverable.

I am now asking that you donate equipment to this department.

The Officers range in size from Large to 3XL.
