Sam is a Christian Jordanian from Amman. His father worked in Jordan with the British Council. This allowed him exposure to both Western and Arabic cultures and languages while growing up. Sam received an Advanced Certificate of Education in Arabic Culture from the University of London, and a B.S. from LSU. He is a subject-matter expert in Middle-Eastern affairs. Currently, he provides consultation and training for the criminal justice sector. His in-depth studies of Arabic and Islamic history and culture provide him a unique capacity, knowledge, and expertise that enable him to provide valuable and objective analysis on Middle-Eastern affairs and the problems associated with Islamist fundamentalism and terrorism.

## Monday

8:00 – 12:00 *Understanding Muslim Culture*

Attendees will obtain training in policymaking and establishing training for departmental officers that will enable them to better understand Islamic theology. Students will be given techniques to help apply their understanding of Islamic theology toward establishing departmental policies, protocol, and procedures. Attendees will be provided with information to help them better understand the motivations and indoctrinations that radical Muslims receive both domestically and abroad.

## Tuesday

8:00 – 12:00 *Radical Islam*

Students will learn of connections of various political (domestic/foreign), social, and economic (drug trafficking, fraudulent/legitimate businesses) ties that radical Muslims utilize to support terrorist activities. They will be given information on; How to monitor Islamic communities and to identify population and community trends associated with radical and militant Islamists; How to distinguish between Sunni and Shi'ite Muslims; and How to distinguish legitimate Arabic names from nicknames, titles and name altering schemes. Topics will include the Qur'an, Sunnah, Shariah law, and militant Islamic ideology associated with Islamic terrorism.

## Wednesday

8:00 – 10:00 *Identifying Radical Islamists (activities & socio-economic ties)*

Attendees will learn how to distinguish between potential radical Muslims and the "average" moderate Muslim during police encounters (through common signs and indicators). Students will be given recommendations on how to train investigators/agents on developing intelligence operations.
